- chain
- slip stitch
- single crochet
- half double crochet
- double crochet
- front post double crochet
- back post double crochet
- double crochet 2 together
- A double crochet 3 together
- double crochet 5 together
- We double crochet 5 in one stitch
- W double crochet 3 in one stitch

chain 4 and double crochet in the first chain = one link



The rounds marked in BLACK are the RIGHT side of the piece. In the diagram, read from RIGHT to left from the three chain stitches instead of the first double crochet.

Used stitches

The rounds marked in RED are the WRONG side of the piece, read from LEFT to right from the three chain stitches instead of the first double crochet.

Stitches in GREEN are the sequence of stitches to be repeated in a round.

The symbols marked in GRAY are repetitions, do not work them again.

MATERIALS: cotton/acrylic 3 ply, bamboo/cotton, 100% cotton, viscose,

yardage about 400/500m per 100g



SIZE ADJUSTMENT

The top is worked top down in rows in 2 separate pieces for the front and back.

At armholes or waist (depending on which cut you choose) 2 separate pieces are joined together and the lower part is worked in rounds.





Make a sample 12 links (chain 4 and double crochet in the first chain x 12) wide and 9 rows high according to DIAGRAM A (see page 6).

Measure the sample and calculate the number of links needed for the full WIDTH of the blouse.

The number of links must be divisible by 3.

The full width is 1/2 the circumference of the hips or the bust depends on which is wider plus 2 times approx. 10 cm.








From one gradient skein - front and back are worked several rows and the color is divided into these two parts - or from two identical skeins.

In both cases, unwind approx. 20m of yarn in the starting color in total for the shoulder seam.

SCHEME A




Description of rows 1, 8 and 11 on pages 7 - 9.

After row 13, repeat from row 4 until the front and back go to the armpits or to the waist.

You can finish working the front and back separately on row 9 or 13.

Fragment of Scheme A for odd number of links in row 1.

NOTE: end of row 11 and beginning of 12 will be different for even and odd number of links in row 1.

dc in the first chain stitch



another chain 4

number of repetitions divisible by 3





ROW 8



5 dc not finished, 6 loops on hook





pull the thread through all the loops, there is one loop on the crochet hook





pull the thread through the last loop





chain 8



ROW 11



chain 3 instead of the first dc, dc, fpdc, turn the piece



chain 2 instead of the first hdc, 2 hdc, turn the piece



chain 3 instead of the



first dc, 2 dc




chain 8 and a sc in the first dc from the previous row



chain 15 and sc in every other dc from previous row



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The previously made joining on the shoulders will make it easier to measure the blouse and adjust the length.



Connecting the bottom of the blouse - fold the rectangles with the wrong side inwards and connect the edges with sc, approx. 10 cm on the left and on the right.


The total number of stitches in the middle (unconnected) section must be divisible by 9.

After joining the edges of the blouse, work the bottom part in rounds.


Initial round on the left side.

Select SCHEME C, D or E


SCHEME C - the upper section ends at row 13



SCHEME D - the upper part ends on row 9 and there are an odd number of stitches




SCHEME E - the upper part ends on row 9 and there is an even number of stitches



After diagram C, D or E, work two ending rows:

SCHEME F - odd number of stitches on round 14 or 20 $SCHEME\ G$ - even number of stitches in round 14 or 20



For the elongated bottom of the blouse, work alternately:

After the 20th round of SCHEME C from the 11th round of SCHEME D or E.

or

After the 14th round of SCHEME D or E from the 15th round of SCHEME C.

SIZE ADJUSTMENT



Make a sample 12 links wide (chain 4 and double crochet in the first chain x 12) and 9 rows high according to SCHEME A (see page 14).

Measure the sample and calculate from the proportion how many links you need to make for the full HEIGHT of the tunic times 2.

The number of links must be divisible by 3.





The tunic is worked vertically from the center up towards the sleeves in 2 separate pieces.


After folding in half at the shoulder line, the sides, back and front are connected.



From one gradient skein - front and back are worked several rows and the color is divided into these two parts - or from two identical skeins.


In both cases, unwind approx. 20m of yarn in the starting color in total for the shoulder seam.

SCHEME A




Description of rows 1, 8 and 11 on pages 6 - 8. After row 13, repeat from row 4 to the desired width.

You can finish working the half separately on row 4 or 10.



After SCHEME A, work two ending rows:

SCHEME H - odd number of stitches in row 4 or 10 SCHEME I - even number of stitches in row 4 or 10



Two parts are folded at the shoulder line and connect the center and sides of the tunic.



SCHEME J - center joining
